

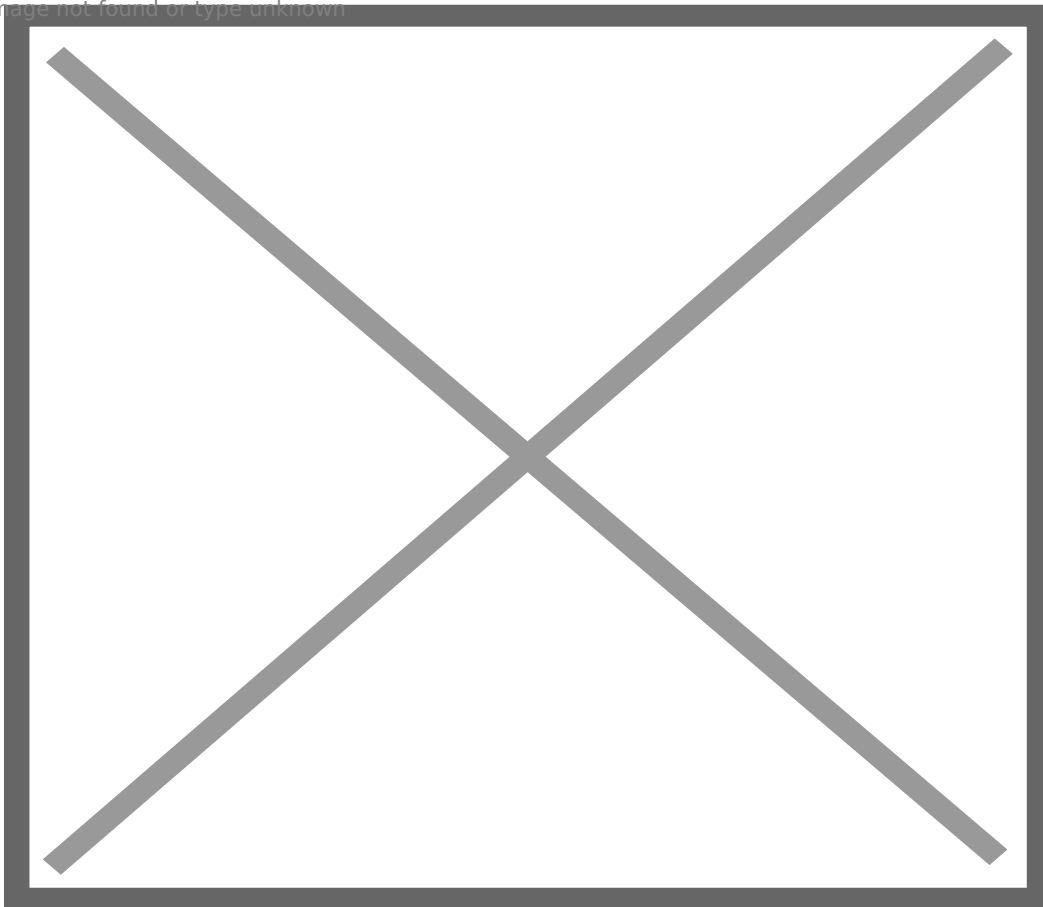
Want some good book recommendations like "Living for pleasure" by Emily Austin
