

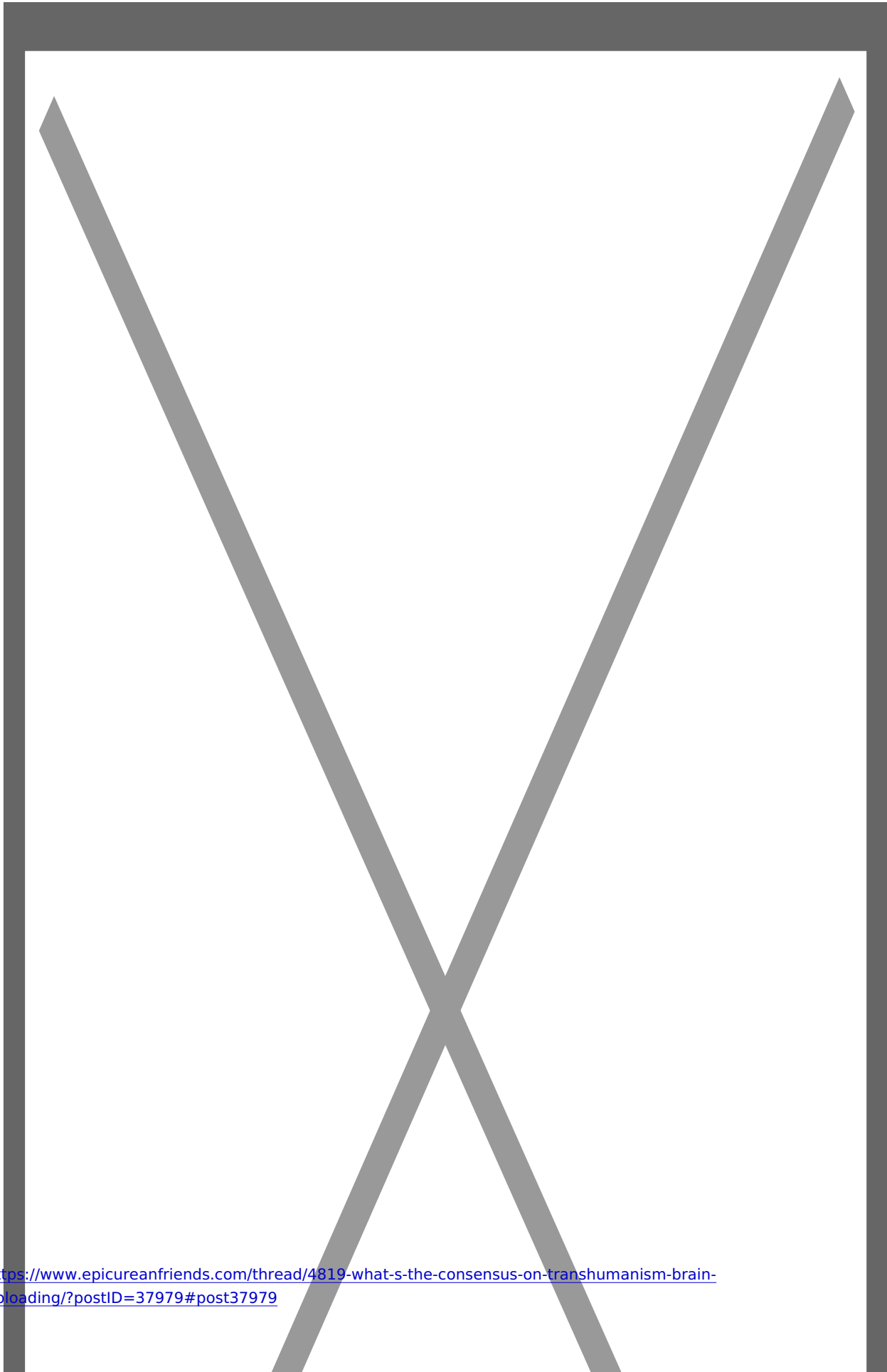
What's the consensus on transhumanism/brain uploading?
