Coincidentally, the 165 bombs were dropped by the allies in Pompeii on 24 August 1943, the same day of the year in AD79 in which the ancient city of Pompeii was formerly believed to have been destroyed by an eruption that killed more than 2,000 people. In October 2018, however, a newly discovered inscription at Pompeii proved that the city was destroyed by Mount Vesuvius after 17 October AD79, and not on 24 August, as previously thought.
