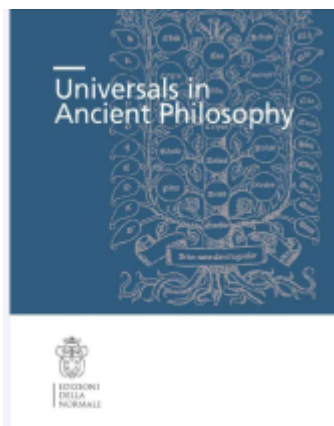


"Universals In Ancient Philosophy" - Several Helpful Chapters
