“Out of the revenues we have given Aynomachus and Timocrates, they are to set aside portions, in consultation with Hermarchus and so far as possible, for the sacrificial offerings for my father, my mother, and my brothers, and for conducting **the customary birthday feast for us every year on the twentieth of Gamelion**, and likewise for the gathering of our fellow philosophers held on the twentieth of every month in memory of us and Metrodorus. They are also to join in celebrating the feast day for my brothers in Posideon; and they are to join in celebrating the feast day for Polyaeus in Metageitnion, just as we have done.”
